Exhibition Requirements

Image and Entry Requirements.

- This exhibition is open to anyone; however, an entry may be rejected when the Sponsor or the Exhibition Organizers, in their reasonable discretion, believes the entry does not conform to exhibition rules and these Conditions of Entry.
- Membership in any photographic organization is not required.

Sanctions: Entries will not be accepted from any entrant who is currently sanctioned by PSA nor FIAP.

PSA Star Ratings & FIAP distinctions

To receive proper Star ratings credit from PSA, entrants must provide their names and country exactly the same in each exhibition. Aliases are not permitted. Please contact PSA in the event of name changes or relocating to another country.

Image Creation:

Entries must originate as photographs (image-captures of objects via light sensitivity) made by the entrant on photographic emulsion or acquired digitally.

Certification:

By virtue of submitting an image, the entrant certifies the work as his or her own (Images may not incorporate elements produced by anyone else (for example: clip art, images or art by others downloaded from the Internet). Aliases are not allowed. The entrant permits the sponsors to reproduce all or part of the entered material free of charge for publication and/or display in media related to the exhibition. This may include low resolution posting on a website.

- Note: Entrants who indicate that their images may not be reproduced or used “will not be eligible for awards” or inclusion in audio-visuals of the exhibition “and could be subject to disqualification” by the exhibition sponsors. The exhibition assumes no liability of any misuse of copyright

Alteration and Computer Generation:

Subject to Divisional restrictions (particularly Nature, Photo Travel, and Photojournalism) images may be altered, either electronically or otherwise, by the maker. Adjustments to enhance images or creatively modify images are allowed providing the underlying photograph is retained in a way that is obvious to the viewer. Images may not be constructed entirely with a computer, and must be the sole work of the author

Re-use of accepted images:

Once an image has been accepted in this exhibition it may not be entered again in any future instances of this exhibition. It may, of course, be entered in any other PSA recognised exhibitions but must always have the same title.

Entry:

An Entry consists of, up to and including, four (4) images entered by a single entrant into the same Section.

Titles:

- Each image must have a unique title that is a description of the image.
- That unique title must be used for entry of that image or of an identical Image into any and all PSA-FIAP Recognized exhibitions.
- Titles must be 35 characters or fewer.
- No titles may be visible to the judges, and nothing in the image may identify the maker.
- Titles may not include file extensions such as .jpg or .jpeg (or any other camera capture filenames such as IMG 471).

- Titles may not consist of personal identifiers possibly augmented by a number; or include words such as “untitled” or “no title”.
- Titles may not consist solely of numbers unless those numbers are prominently contained within the image, such as a contestant number in a race.

Color and Monochrome images from the same capture that share substantial pictorial content in common will be considered the same image and must be given the same title.

Print identification:

- The title on the backs of prints must match the titles on the Entry Form.
- Family Name, Given Name, Title and sequence number correspond to Inscription Form
- Only pressure sensitive (self-adhesive) labels may be used on the back of unmounted prints.
- The entrant must sign the entry submittal form in the space provided to verify authorization for the exhibition to destroy the exhibitor’s prints in lieu of returning them otherwise the full entry fee shall apply if the exhibition does have separate fees for return of prints and non-return of prints.

Prints or mounting format:

- Minimum size: A4 or 20 cm x 30 cm, maximum: 40 cm x 50 cm.
- Prints can be mounted on light cardboard or un-mounted (maximum size 40 cm x 50 cm)

The Exhibition will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the FIAP and PSA

Jury’ decisions will be final without appeal.

The organizers will select the pictures for the public exhibition.

According to FIAP regulation **Acceptance Range** will be up to 25%

An entrant’s images will not be presented to the judges consecutively. An entrant’s four images will be distributed throughout four rounds of judging in that section. Distribution of images will be in the same round order as submitted by the entrant.

An image may be entered in only one section

Judging method for Projected Images

Internet judging in accordance with FIAP regulations (Info 172/20).
Selection of award winning images at Riedisheim on HD screen.

Image files definition:

Jpg format, maximum size: width 3840 pixels x height 2560 pixels, 3 MB.

Registration:

For all sections (Prints and Projected Images)

Entries will be via the “on-line” Entry Form.

Notice:

When an entrant fills in the Entry Form to submit an entry the entrant will see a feature to affirm he or she has read these Conditions of Entry when he or she fills out the entry form. If the entrant does not so affirm the entry will not be submitted.

Protection of Entrants' Personal information

- By entering this exhibition, you are explicitly consenting to the personal details you have supplied, including email addresses, being held, processed and used by the exhibition organizers for purposes associated with this exhibition.
- You also explicitly consent to such information being sent to organizations that have accorded official recognition, patronage or accreditation to this exhibition.
- You acknowledge and accept that entering this exhibition means that the status and results of your entry may be made public.

Statement on Subject Matter applicable to all sections

- The fundamental rule that must be observed at all times and **applies to all sections** offered in exhibitions with FIAP patronage or PSA recognition is that **the welfare of living creatures is more important than any photograph.**
- This means that practices such as baiting of subjects with a living creature and removal of birds from nests, for the purpose of obtaining a photograph, are highly unethical, and such photographs are not allowed in any exhibition with FIAP patronage or PSA recognition.
- Under no circumstances may a living creature be placed in a situation where it will be killed, injured or stressed for the purpose of obtaining a photograph.
- This rule applies regardless of whether or not the creature being killed, injured or stressed is visible in the captured image.
- There are also concerns about the use of aerial photography, drones, helicopters, low flying aircraft. These should not cause any interference with other individuals or animals which causes a disturbance in their normal activity or disrupt the way any individuals or animals interact with their environment.
- Entry in this exhibition is conditional on accepting these policies. The content of images must comply with these General Conditions and with the Division and Section definitions listed in these conditions. Images that - in the sole opinion of the judges or the Exhibition Organizers - do not comply, will be disqualified so the entrant may be aware of the problem when considering entry into other exhibitions with FIAP patronage/PSA recognition.

Definitions

Monochrome (FIAP):

A black and white work fitting from the very dark grey (black) to the very clear grey (white) is a monochrome work with the various shades of grey. A black and white work toned entirely in a single colour will remain a monochrome work able to stand in the black and white category; such a work can be reproduced in black and white in the catalogue of a salon under FIAP Patronage.

On the other hand a black and white work modified by a partial toning or by the addition of one colour becomes a colour work (polychrome) to stand in the colour category; such a work requires colour reproduction in the catalogue of a salon under FIAP Patronage.

Monochrome (PSA):

An image is considered to be Monochrome only if it gives the impression of having no color (i.e. contains only shades of gray which can include pure black and pure white) OR it gives the impression of being a greyscale image that has been toned in one color across the entire image. (For example by Sepia, red, gold, etc.) A greyscale or multi-colored image modified or giving the impression of having been modified by partial toning, multi-toning or by the inclusion of spot coloring does not meet the definition of monochrome and shall be classified as a Color Work.

Women:

All representations of women, in its intimacy, in studio, with her family, at work, in daily life, in recreational or sports activities, etc.

Nude photographs are accepted.

Images, whose main subject is the representation of women, can show one or more persons.

Creative Photography:

All topics are accepted.

A creative photograph must be original, inventive, and can be a montage of multiple images.

All images incorporated into the photograph must be made by the author by photographic emulsion or digitally captured.

The original images can be modified but it is necessary that the basic content of the image predominates and is identifiable.

The submitted work must remain photography and not digital art done only with the computer.

Prize of the best Club:

The club with the highest accepted image will be proclaimed best Club of the contest.

In the event of a tie, the number of points obtained will be taken into account.

Breaches of Rules

If, at any time, it is determined in the reasonable discretion of the exhibition organizer or the judges before, during, or after the judging of an exhibition that an entrant has submitted entries where one or more images may fail to comply with these Conditions of Entry, including the stated definitions, the exhibition organizers reserve the right to delete the entry from the exhibition and void any or all acceptances or awards in connection with the exhibition. Fees may be forfeited or refunded in these circumstances. The entrant acknowledges that the decision of the exhibition organizers or the judges is final

In order to ensure that images comply with the Conditions of Entry and definitions, the exhibition organizers may carry out reasonable measures to verify that:

- a) the images are the original work of the entrant and
- b) the images comply with the rules and definitions as set out in these Conditions of Entry

These steps include, but are not limited to, questioning any entrant, requiring the submission of RAW files or other digital files representing the original capture of the submitted image(s), confronting the entrant with evidence that one or more submitted images fails to comply with the Conditions of Entry (also known as Entry Rules), and offering the entrant a reasonable opportunity to provide counter evidence to refute the exhibition organizer's evidence by a set deadline. Such entries that are not cleared or are still questionable after the entrant has presented evidence may be considered in breach of these Conditions of Entry, and declined. Such entries may be referred to PSA for further investigation of possible ethics violations.
